


## **New Mexico: Conquering COVID**

What does that mean? In nine weeks, we are <u>OPEN</u>






## **Choosing Safer Activities**

Safest		Attend a small, outdoor gathering with fully vaccinated family and friends	
		Attend a small, outdoor gathering with fully vaccinated and unvaccinated people	
Less Safe		Dine at an outdoor restaurant with friends from multiple households	
Least Safe		Attend a crowded, outdoor event, like a live performance, parade, or sports event



#### RED YELLOW GREEN TURQUOISE FRAMEWORK

- Basic Principle: Track key metrics that indicate overall community safety:
  - Case rate by county (cases/day/100,000)
  - Test positivity rate
- Our success in vaccinations is a very important contributor to community safety and will influence the other two metrics as well.




### **RED YELLOW GREEN TURQUOISE CHANGES**

### CONQUERING COVID: NEW FULL VACCINATION RATE METRIC


- Based on completed vaccinations (one J&J or two Pfizer or Moderna).
- Numerator: cumulative number final dose State Vaccines + Federal Vaccines administered to county residents ≥16 years old.\*
- Denominator: county population eligible for vaccine = ≥16 years old.\*
- If a county is at or above every-twoweek target, then it "meets" the metric.
- Target increases by 5% every 2 weeks = 42,015 New Mexicans fully vaccinated per week.





#### WE MUST REMAIN VIGILANT - THE VIRUS IS CHANGING!

- Get registered. Get vaccinated.

- If you have COVID-19, learn if you're eligible for monoclonal antibody treatment.
- We ALL need to stay committed to fighting the virus for several more months.
- Please do NOT go to work or school if sick



## Primary care providers – a key partner

- DOH supporting primary care providers to administer vaccine.
- Primary care providers in a unique position to hold intimate, meaningful conversations with patients about vaccination.
- Call your patients, encourage them to get vaccinated, and offer vaccinations to patients who are visiting your facility for other reasons.



## Community health workers and community-based organizations: increasing vaccine access and education

Community health workers (CHWs) partner with DOH and local community organizations to identify barriers to vaccine, help with registration, and educate to increase vaccine confidence

- DOH is working to provide clear, validated scientific information about COVID-19, vaccines, and related health topics.


